DENTAL THERAPY CENTRE

Spencer Park Dental Therapy Centre offers free dental examinations, oral care advice, preventative, restorative and emergency treatment for children from pre-primary to Year 11.

Enrolment forms will soon be issued to your child if they have recently changed schools or enrolled in Pre-Primary, <u>please return the forms to your school by</u> <u>Friday 19th April if you wish to use our service.</u>

Parents of enrolled students are reminded to contact the centre to update your details if you have moved in the last few years. All appointments are posted home, many are returned due to incorrect addresses, this means that your child misses out on their dental visit. If you no longer intend to use our service and attend a private dental clinic, please let us know as soon as possible as your valuable appointment could be taken up by someone else. You can call us on 9841 3967 or send us an email to <u>spencerparkdtc@health.wa.gov.au</u>.

Unfortunately, our clinics do not have reception staff, your child will be enrolled as soon as possible. They may not receive an exam appointment for up to 12 months. Please call us if your child is in pain.

HEAD LICE

We have had quite a few cases of Head Lice across the school in the last few weeks. Please check your child/children's hair over the break and treat as necessary. Please make sure if your child has long hair it is tied up appropriately.

Regular checking of hair will help us keep on top of this itchy situation.
