

NEW SHARED PATH OPEN: MALEY PLACE, BARDLEY ROAD AND WANSBOROUGH STREET



Construction of the new shared path on Bardley Road, Maley Place and Wansborough Street is now complete.

This path is 624m long, with 8 pram ramps (crossing points).

It will help provide a safe connection between Ulster Rd and Hardie Road for pedestrians and cyclists.
