# YOUR MOVE

Reflecting on our involvement in Your Move this year has been an opportunity to celebrate our journey. We have had a busy year at Spencer Park this year and have achieved:

- Student leader team participating in leadership labs
- Applying for and securing \$5000 funding from Southern Ports towards the student led initiative of covering the bike/scooter racks
- Hosting active transport days each term with breakfast on arrival
- Student leader team organizing activities on the quadrangle for each whole school event
- Applying for a \$350 West Cycle grant towards our Bike Month event
- Collaborating with the City of Albany to produce a Spencer Park specific map
- Collaborating with the City of Albany to promote the new paths around our school
- Installed Spencer Park specific signage to promote active transport
- Conducted Hands Up Surveys
- Awarded prizes throughout the year to encourage active transport

Pleasingly, all our efforts are making a difference. Comparing our 2023 and 2024 end of year hands up surveys we have had:

- A 12% increase in walking
- A 32% increase in cycling
- A 34% increase in public transport usage
- A 16% decrease in car usage

Our school community thoroughly enjoy whole school active transport events and participate with enthusiasm. One of our focuses for 2025 will be to increase active transport across the entire school year. When interviewed by Emma Jack from Your Move we summarised our journey as, a positive, but still meandering path in the right direction.

Thank you to all our families, students, staff, the P&C, and extended community for your support. We look forward to continuing to achieve wonderful things in 2025.



# YEAR 6 CAMP






