Media Consent

BIKE SAFETY

Riding in the rain is more dangerous than riding in dry conditions for an obvious reason: slippery when wet. The road itself is slicker. Painted surfaces and metal road obstacles are like ice. It takes longer to stop and it's easier to slide out, so you need to brake earlier and lighter, especially on **wet** descents

• Obey the rules of the road

• Current WA legislation states that everyone must wear an approved cycling helmet that meets Australian Standards (AS2063:2008 – Bicycle helmets) and fits the child's head correctly.

• For young cyclists, a footpath or shared path is the best place to cycle, unless a no bicycles sign is on display. When using footpaths, look out for cars entering or exiting driveways.

- If you see something broken, tell a teacher or other adult.
















Welcome back breakfast
