Dear Parents and Friends

Welcome Back

Concert in the Park

Stage 4 Restrictions Continue

As many of you would already be aware the State Government has extended the Stage 4 Restrictions, which will have some implications for larger events at the school:

- Concert Night As an outside event all parents and community members are welcome and asked to undertake physical distancing and good hygiene practices. The event will be cancelled if the weather is not suitable.
- Faction Carnival As an outside event all parents and community members are welcome and asked to undertake physical distancing and good hygiene practices. The event will be postponed if the weather is not suitable.
- Colour Explosion As an outside event all parents and community members are welcome and asked to undertake physical distancing and good hygiene practices. The event will be postponed if the weather is not suitable.
- Christmas Concert & POE Assembly The school would request that only parents of students performing in the assembly or receiving an award attend and please exercise physical distancing and good hygiene practices.

 Graduation – Restrictions on the number of staff, non-graduating students and invited guests will be applied to ensure that priority is given to family members. Further information regarding graduation will be sent home in the coming weeks to those families involved.

VEGIE PATCH

The space between the Library and T&E shed is being developed into a vegie patch. Kindy, Pre-primary, Year one and two children will be using it as part of their hands-on learning. Science classes will also be able to access this area.





Our Maintenance Blitz Funding enabled us to purchase a small tool shed, 3 raised garden beds, outside sink and work station and get some landscaping completed, with a new trellis for our passionfruit vine to grow up, a windbreak garden and a fruit tree garden bed. Unfortunately, that was the limit of our funding. We still needed to get plants!





Lisa Gungor, Activities Officer for Bunnings, has been a great supporter of various activities for Spencer Park Primary in the past. When she was approached to see if Bunnings could provide a few plants to establish the Vegie Patch her generous reply was 'Of course!'





We have now planted 5 fruit trees, a rosemary bush, 3 lavenders, 2 tomatoes and received an extra raised garden bed (when they arrive). It created some excitement amongst the children instantly. An additional apple tree was donated by the wonderful Landscaper, Stuart Munro who has been beautifying some areas around our school. Unfortunately, the first

day of the holidays someone took our lemon tree which was part of the windbreak garden.

At least we have the bones of a Vegie Patch. We are hoping that the children experience endless learning opportunities in the natural world.


