Is your Child Ready to Learn?

Ensuring that your child comes to school ready to learn is an important part of students having a successful day at school. So what does this look like?

At the basic level it is ensuring that students:

- Have a good sleep the night before school 10-12 hours.
- Fill their tummies with a nutritious breakfast that will sustain them until 10.30am. Please do not feed children lots of sugar or foods with high levels of colours/preservatives, as this is not helpful to sitting still in class and learning. Keep recess & lunches as healthy as possible.
- Maintain a routine of what occurs each morning. Like us children function better with a routine.
- Wearing a school uniform ensures that students look the same as one another and that they are mentally prepared for school.
- Ensure that they are physically well. Please do not send students that are suffering colds, upset stomachs, headaches or other ailments.

There are many other elements that ensure students are ready to learn, but these areas are ones that staff regularly deal with across all classes on a day to day basis. We appreciate parents and caregivers that are daily providing for these elements, so that teachers can focus on the other factors that ensure students are ready to learn.

Teach Learn Grow (TLG)

We are very fortunate to have a group of university students at SPPS here next week providing assistance for our students in learning math skills and knowledge. The TLG volunteers use hands on activities and games to teach math concepts, ensuring that learning is undertaken with fun! 
