#### **Sensory Rooms**

Throughout 2020 the school undertook the establishment of areas within our school where students could engage, under teacher direction, in a sensory break. These rooms provide students with an opportunity to take a small break from the teaching and learning environment to re-set their thinking, behaviour or feelings and then re-engage in meaningful learning. These breaks could involve a physical activity or a calming activity depending on what the student requires. Not all students use or require access to these spaces, but for those students who do, they are a wonderful addition to the classroom program.

The P&C have donated money to provide a rowing machine in the senior sensory room.

### **Swimming Lessons**

Rm 8-11 have commenced their swimming lessons this week at Emu Point. Interm Swimming is a school-based swimming program for children from Preprimary to Year 7. It provides quality swimming lessons

across the State to ensure children develop vital swimming and water safety skills. Lessons will operate

in line with current health advice. Physical distancing and good hygiene practices are in place. We strongly encourage ALL students to participate in these lessons.

#### Split Classes and Student Ability

Each year the school fields questions regarding our split classes and the provision of different ability within these classes. All classes, including split classes, are based on a number of factors including; social needs, behavioural factors, special needs, student ability, parent requests and teacher judgements. The creation of a high ability and low ability classrooms is not how the school structures general classes. The provision of different academic levels is provided in a variety of ways in all classrooms including; differentiated curriculum, small groups and cross-setting structures. If parents have any queries about class structures or provision of academic ability, please talk to your classroom teacher or administration.

## DENTAL THERAPY CENTRE NEWS

Spencer Park Dental Therapy Centre provides free dental examinations, oral care advice, preventative, restorative and emergency treatment for children from pre-primary to Year 11. The clinic is staffed by Kayleen (Dental Nurse), Susanne (Dental Therapist), Jaqui (Dental Nurse), Kristy (Dental Therapist) and Nick (Dentist).

Enrolment forms have been issued to your child if he/she has recently changed schools or enrolled in Pre-Primary, <u>please make sure these forms are returned before Friday 26<sup>th</sup> March if you wish to use our service.</u>

Parents of enrolled students are reminded to contact the centre to update your details if you have moved in the last few years. All appointments are posted home and many of these are returned to us due to incorrect addresses, this means that your child misses out on their dental visit. If you no longer intend to use our service please let us know as soon as possible as your valuable appointment could be taken up by someone else. You can call us on 9841 3967, drop in or send us an email to spencerparkdtc@dental.health.wa.gov.au.

To keep your child's teeth healthy during this important stage of growth we recommend brushing twice a day, parents should always assist with one daily brush and use adult strength toothpaste providing children are spitting it out. Teeth should be brushed for a minimum of two minutes and children are encouraged NOT to rinse after brushing.


#### Key Word Sign




