Bibbulmun Track Challenge

Over the last few weeks classes, have been participating in the Bibblulmun Track Challenge, which requires students to run laps of the oval to obtain the cumulative distance of the Bibbulmun (1000km). This activity is a great way for our students to increase fitness levels for the Cross-Country events later in the term, but to also appreciate the stamina and persistence required in achieving this activity.



New Undercover Area for School Garden

This area will provide shelter for students during the winter months, so that science lessons can continue regardless of conditions. A new water tank will also be installed to catch rain from the undercover area. This will supplement the water being used for our garden.

NAPLAN TESTING



Throughout this week and next, Year 3 & 5 students will be participating in NAPLAN testing. The four tests will cover areas of Writing, Reading, Language Conventions and Numeracy. These tests provide students with an opportunity to participate in a formal testing experience and will also provide the school with information about performance of cohorts and individuals. Individual NAPLAN results will be provided to parents once results are finalised, which is generally around the end of term 3.

Ideas for Parents to Promote Student Engagement

Parents' support for their child's school performance and involvement in school is really important, but can take different forms. Some ideas to use are:

- Modelling the importance of learning, selfdiscipline, and hard work. Your child learns from your behaviours and attitudes. You can enhance your child's engagement and success in school by demonstrating a commitment to learning and hard work.
- Setting and enforcing high but realistic expectations. Your child is more likely to achieve and succeed when you and your child's teachers have high expectations.
- Providing structure and monitoring. A consistent pattern of age-appropriate monitoring and supervision can increase your child's chances for success in school.
- Knowing what is going on at school. If you stay abreast of what is going on at school, you can have a positive impact on your child's attitudes and behaviours toward school.
- Making your home a learning environment. A supportive and stable home environment has a positive impact on school performance and the degree to which your child is engaged in school and learning.
- Being persistent and consistent. For education to remain a priority for your child, be both persistent and consistent when providing support for your child's learning.

Room 13 have been learning all about money, and enjoying learning using visual and sensory aids.


















AUSLAN / Key Word Sign

Applications for your child to be involved in Kindergarten (children turning 4 by 30 June 2022) and Pre-Primary (children turning 5 by 30 June 2022) are now being taken at our school office. If your child is entering our school for the first time their birth certificate and immunisation certificate from the Australian Children's Immunisation Registry will be required.

The closing date for applications is Friday 30 July. Whilst we will continue to take applications for enrolment in these programs for the remainder of the year, getting your application in before the closing date will be important in securing a place with our school in 2022.

If your child is currently enrolled in our Kindergarten program you will need to make contact with the school office to ensure that your child is on our Pre-Primary list for 2022.
