Dear Parents and Friends

COVID Update

Communication: As part of our planning for the possibility of a COVID outbreak at SPPS we would like to inform the school community of how this information will be initially shared. If the school receives confirmation of a positive case effecting SPPS, parents and carers will be informed via our SMS mobile phone messaging system. It is of high importance, therefore, that all contact information is up to date and accurate.

The message will outline information provided by the Department of Health, which will include what action is required. The school will maintain communication with parents via the SMS system, but also have information on our Facebook page and website.

Connect Communities: In the event of classes or individual students needing to isolate, the school has established a Connect Community for parents to join. This will provide access to work packages for different year levels and another line of communication to teaching staff. An invitation to join this community has been sent to all parent email contacts, so please check these – even your junk emails. This resource should only be used when students/classes are required to isolate.

<u>Learning Programs</u>: Learning programs will remain in place, but will be modified to limit the movement and mingling of students if we experience an outbreak. This will have some impact on literacy and numeracy groups.

<u>School Activities:</u> With an expected peak of cases occurring towards the end of this term, the school is taking a cautious and practical approach to larger

school activities. Events such as the Faction Swimming Carnival, Ride 2 School & Young Writers will be reviewed and a decision made closer to the time. Where possible a modified activity may be undertaken.

The Department of Education has released a helpful <u>leaflet</u> that you may find helpful.

Swimming Lessons

Rm 8-11 have completed their swimming lessons at Emu Point. In-term Swimming is a school-based swimming program for children from Pre-primary to Year 6. It provides quality swimming lessons across the State to ensure children develop vital swimming and water safety skills. It was fantastic to see so many of our students OPTING IN and giving swimming lessons a go!

Children's University Information and FAQs for Families

Spencer Park Primary School is teaming up with the Children's University of WA to offer year 3, 4 and 5 students the chance to broaden their learning beyond the classroom.

What is Children's University?

The program helps children to grow their love of learning, build self-confidence, and develop aspirations for their future – all through fun learning experiences! Watch: https://out.be/NNx7ggN3Wiro

Children choose which learning activities they would like to participate in and earn time and stamps in a Passport to Learning as they go. There are a wide range of activities at school, in the community, and online. Your child may already be involved in activities that count towards their passport hours, such as sporting teams or music tuition. In addition, the school Library Officer and the Chaplain are available to offer extra encouragement and support for the learning.

Annual Membership

Membership is voluntary. A fee of \$16.50 is payable online (see information pack that your child brings home) and covers their passport and graduation gowns and certificates.

What is graduation?

Once children reach 30 hours of stamps in their Passport to Learning, they and their family are invited to the graduation ceremony at the end of the year. This ceremony is a celebration of the children's learning and efforts, where friends, family members and teachers are all welcome to come and share the children's achievements. Children can graduate multiple times over several years, aiming higher as they go.



SENIOR IN-TERM SWIMMING LESSONS

Students form Rooms 8, 9 and 11 attended annual Interm Swimming lessons at Emu Point last week. Though we had mixed weather conditions, attendance was good. Swimming lessons for the remainder of our students will take place in Term, 3 pending restriction conditions at that time.







CONSTABLE CARE

Last Thursday we were lucky to have Constable Care visit our school to deliver some important safety messages. The PP-year 2 students learnt about the numbers to call if they need help, and what constitutes an emergency. This helps us to determine whether to call 000 (Emergencies – Police, Ambulance, Fire Brigade), 131 444 (non-urgent Police assistance) or 1800 333 000 (Crime Stoppers).

The year 3-4 students learnt about 'Frenemies.' The key messages in their performance were about making friends, being inclusive and respectful of everyone and showing care and consideration for others. It reinforced our SPPS school values perfectly.



The upper primary students watched a show called 'Trending', and focused on staying safe while online. Some of the key concepts it covered included Cyber Bullying and what to do if it happens to you, gaining consent before 117781 posting pictures or videos of other people online, and safe, lawful and respectful use of online forums.

The Constable Care shows were entertaining and very educational. We hope they will visit us again soon.
